Language note 1+: Four conjugations

1. Look at the following sentences:

tū in popīnā labōrās. tū in cellā dormis.

You work in the bar. You sleep in the room.

Both verbs mean *you* are doing something, so end **-s**. If you look more closely, you'll see that **laborās** ends **-ās** and **dormīs** ends **-īs**. That's because they are different types of verbs which have very slightly different endings.

2. There are four main types of verbs in Latin and these four types are known as **conjugations**. Notice the difference in their endings:

	1st Conjugation	2 nd Conjugation	3 rd Conjugation	4 th Conjugation
1	labōr ō	rid eō	leg ō	dorm iō
you (s.)	labōr ās	rid ēs	leg <mark>is</mark>	dorm īs
he, she, it	labōr at	rid et	leg it	dorm it

3. When reading Latin, the -ō, -s and -t endings are enough to tell us who is carrying out the action. However, when writing Latin, we need to know which conjugation the Latin verb is.
